Weekly Pay Frequency for Bank Workers – making it work for everyone As confirmed last week, we are permanently moving to weekly pay for all bank workers. While overall it is a positive move for bank workers, it has brought an increase in workload for some teams, which both bank workers and line managers can help to reduce. Always remember the deadline for shift authorisation is 12noon, each Wednesday; our survey indicated there had been a 128% increase in shifts not being authorised. If you are a bank worker, you can use Employee Online to see if your shifts have been authorised. If they haven't, please contact your line manager, rather than the NMAHP Bank office or Payroll.

A plea also to line managers to ensure they authorise shifts work by 12noon each Wednesday. Shifts not authorised on time lead to numerous queries and often the bank worker understandably requesting a payment to be made outwith the normal payroll process. It may also risk their willingness to work more bank shifts.

There have been an increasing number of calls about pay day - weekly pay day is Friday of each week. The Payroll intranet page Pages - WeeklyBankPay (scot.nhs.uk) provides details of when worked shifts will be paid. This page also encourages bank workers to elect for an electronic payslip or apply for them to be posted. Please consider this as a significant number of payslips are not being collected. Making these small changes will help to reduce your colleagues' workload and ensure the system runs smoothly.

MMR vaccination Following on from the staff MMR vaccination clinic at Foresterhill Lea last week, we can confirm those of you based in Aberdeenshire can attend any of the vaccination clinics there for a vaccination consultation. This applies to the centres in Peterhead, Fraserburgh, Macduff, Huntly, Inverurie, Stonehaven, and Banchory **only**, appointments are not required, you must have a note of your vaccination history with you. If you are not sure whether you have had the MMR, please contact your GP, but remember they can only confirm your status; they are not able to administer vaccinations.
