Site security - a shared responsibility NHS Fife have been given a formal reprimand, after an unknown individual, posing as an agency nurse, was able to access a hospital ward, interact with patients, and view paper handover notes. This incident is a sharp reminder about the role we all must play in the keeping ourselves, the people we care for, and the buildings we work in, safe. Always remember the following:

- Make sure your staff ID badge is visible.
- Don't be afraid to ask why someone is in your ward/clinic/office if you don't recognise them and don't be offended if someone asks you to identify yourself.
- Make sure security doors are properly closed. If there is a fault with a lock (of any kind) log a repair request with Facilities & Estates.
- Make sure all confidential information is appropriately stored whether it's notes or electronic records. Keep desks clear and lock PCs/other devices when not in use.
- Do not share any confidential information (either in-person or over the phone/by email) if you are not sure who you are speaking to. It is ok to pause and check someone's identity; genuine callers will not object to you taking the time to confirm.
- Make sure confidential waste is properly disposed of. Do not leave confidential waste bags in public areas.
- Only take confidential information (whether paper copies or electronic documents) off-site if you are authorised to do so.

'Flu & COVID-19 vaccination programme If you have not yet taken the opportunity to get your free 'flu and COVID-19 vaccinations, it's not too late. All NHS staff are eligible for a 'flu jab; anyone whose job brings them into direct contact with patients is also eligible for COVID-19 immunisation. Both 'flu and COVID-19 remain serious illnesses; these jabs offer vital protection to you, to your families, and to the people we care for.

All Aberdeenshire clinics, along with the Aberdeen City Vaccination Centre (Bon Accord) and Fiona Elcock Vaccination Centre, are now offering drops ins for health & social care staff. In addition, there are dedicated staff only clinics happening in Moray, Aberdeenshire, and Aberdeen, in a range of locations. An updated list is attached to the email used to send this brief.

HEPMA & upcoming junior doctor rotation Implementation of Hospital Electronic Prescribing & Medicines Administration (HEPMA) is well underway across ARI (including Roxburghe House). Woodend Hospital is next on the list, scheduled for early 2024. All FY1/FY2/IMTs due to rotate into either ARI or Woodend must have completed the appropriate mandatory HEPMA TURAS eLearning module(s) prior to receiving a HEPMA username and password.

When you have completed the appropriate eLearning(s), log a call with the IT Service Desk via ext 54444 or <u>online portal</u> advising completion. You will then receive your HEPMA username and password by email.
