
coronavirus VID-19Brief

Here is the brief for Friday 15 April 2022.

Online referrals to Occupational Health Service (OHS) The OHS department is experiencing a technical difficulties whereby online forms can be completed but not received by the OHS department. We are working with NSS (who host the website) to correct the issue, but it is unlikely to be resolved prior to the holiday weekend. Until the issue is resolved, please do not submit any online forms as they will not be received or processed by the OHS department. This includes Pre-placement Screenings, Wellbeing Referrals, and Management Referrals. Any online forms submitted after **7pm yesterday** (14 April) will need to be resubmitted. We will advise as soon as the problem is resolved. Sorry for any inconvenience this may cause.

Where are we with COVID-19? Our most recent situation update video, presented by Marj Johnston, <u>can be found here</u>. It will give you a brief overview of what we know about transmission locally. Trends continue to be positive this week, with a further drop in case numbers - however, this is also in the context of fewer and fewer tests being taken which means we are likely to be seeing a smaller and smaller tip of the iceberg. Having said that, the national Office for National Statistics (ONS) data, which is less susceptible to these changing testing behaviours, also continues to show a downward trend at a Scotland-wide level, now at 1 in 17 people estimated to be currently infected vs 1 in 11 three weeks earlier (this is updated compared to data available in Marj's presentation). While this is a very significant drop in infections, it should be noted that this is still very high and we also can't take a continued decline for granted - as Marj discusses in the video, in Northern Ireland, their transmission levels dropped after they reached a peak but then began to fluctuate at a very high level. Hospital admissions and occupancy have both dropped significantly over the last week or so, following an all-time high in COVID occupancy of nearly 200 beds. The drop in occupancy is largely explained by a drop in 'hospital onset' cases while occupancy FOR covid (i.e., admitted due to COVID-19 symptoms) remains relatively stable.
