
## coronavirus VID-19Brief

Here is the brief for Monday 6 September 2021.

**Grampian data** The local update for today (and over the weekend) is shown below. A national update is available on the <u>Public Health Scotland daily dashboard</u>.



**COVID-19 vaccination for 12-15 year olds** As you will no doubt be aware by now, the JCVI have expanded the list of conditions which would make children aged 12-15 eligible for COVID-19 vaccination. However, they stopped short of recommending universal vaccination for this age group. In their announcement, the JCVI said consideration of wider societal impact, and the potential educational benefit, of vaccinating more widely in this age group was not within their remit. The matter is now under consideration by the four UK Chief Medical Officers.

**NHS Superannuation Scheme – Annual Benefits Statement** The Scottish Public Pensions Agency have advised that 2021 Annual Benefit Statements (2020 for General Medical Practitioners) for active members of the NHS Pension Schemes (Scotland) are available now on SPPA Online Member Services.

Your Annual Benefit Statement includes:

- Accrued pension benefits
- Current level of death benefits
- Lifetime Allowance (LTA) information

To qualify for 2021 Annual Benefit Statement:

- You must have paid pension contributions between 01/4/2020 and 31/03/2021
- You must have been an active contributing member of the scheme at 31/03/2021 and at the point the statement is calculated.

SPPA have a small quantity of Annual Benefit Statements still to produce for some active members, if your 2021 statement is not available when you log-on to the member portal, then please recheck again prior to 31 October before contacting the SPPA. **HCPC registration** If you are due to renew your registration with the Health & Care Professions Council (HCPC) and are experiencing difficulties or delays in updating your contact details with them, we have been advised that <a href="mailto:priorityreg@hcpc-uk.org">priorityreg@hcpc-uk.org</a> is promptly managed and responded to. Clinical scientists, prosthetists & orthotists, and speech & language therapists have until the end of September 2021 to renew their registration. Please only use the above email if you are in one of those professional groups.

It is the responsibility of each individual registrant to keep their registration up to date. A lapsed professional registration will impact on your ability to work and will most likely result in a disciplinary hearing in line with NHSScotland Workforce policies.

The survey window is open until 20 September, and we are all encouraged to participate. This should take 5-10 minutes and all responses are anonymous.
