Deployed? We want to hear from you You will be aware many of the policies and procedures introduced in response to COVID-19 have been withdrawn or concluded over recent months. We are now considering the deactivation of 'The Management of the Workforce during and after Major Incidents including Pandemic' Policy. A provision of the Policy currently enacted is the deployment of staff. We are aware a number of you are currently deployed, due to our COVID-19 response, to roles outwith your usual teams, or your usual role within your existing department, or at another location within NHS Grampian. We want to ensure we are aware of everyone deployed therefore, if you are currently deployed, as a direct response to the pandemic, please get in touch with Diane Annand (Staff Governance Manager) by emailing diane.annand@nhs.scot with the following information below. You must also copy in your substantive line manager.

- Name
- Substantive post and department
- Deployed role and department
- Date when your deployment began and expected end date if known.

Drug related deaths The latest figures on drug related deaths were published today and show a continuing high number of deaths across Scotland. Behind those figures are real people and their deaths are a tragedy for them, their families and friends, and the wider community.

Illicit benzodiazepines continue to be a significant factor locally as well as cocaine. Most deaths involved opioid base substances. Naloxone is a medicine designed to temporarily reverse an opioid overdose. It is available to "take away and carry" from lots of places. If you, or anyone you know, is at risk of an opioid overdose you should have a kit. They are free and easy to use, and a nasal spray version is available.

Naloxone kits are available to take home from Community Pharmacies. Naloxone kits can also be ordered online or over the phone (08080 101011) from Scottish Families Affected by Alcohol & Drugs. These are posted to you in plain packaging.

Internet Access / Web Hosted Application Access A national change has been scheduled to take place THIS Saturday (30 July), between 00:00 and 06:00 which will impact on internet access and web hosted applications. It is difficult to pinpoint the exact timings of the outage, but we are expecting a brief period of interruption, no longer than 15 minutes at the following times: 00:00, 01:30 and 03:00.

The systems affected by this change are as follows:

- Internet Access (Access to internal SharePoint (e.g., Intranet) will be unaffected)
- SWAN Secure Web Access (Remote Access from non-NHSG devices)
- Badgernet (this will be switched over to local failover therefore can be used as normal)
- Microsoft365 (Email, Teams, SharePoint Online, Office Web Applications)
- Endoscopy Management System (EMS)
- Vision360
- Vision Community Nursing
- EMIS Web
