Dr Gray's Hospital Plan for the Future 2023-2033 – Update We have a key commitment within the <u>Plan for the Future</u> to develop a long-term plan for Dr Gray's Hospital with the aim of improving recruitment and retention of staff and to ensure confidence in the local delivery of specialist care. Engagement began in June and ran through to December 2022 with staff, the public and partners being at the heart of the approach. Thank you to everyone who gave their views during the engagement period. Feedback has been carefully analysed and responses have been summarised into three themes - People, Places and Pathways - with 13 draft high level priority areas identified.

The Grampian NHS Board will meet this Thursday (2 February) and will consider a Strategic Intent Proposal for Dr Gray's Plan for the Future. You can read this paper – along with all the board papers – on the NHS Grampian website. The summary engagement report, which forms part of this document, has been attached to the email used to send this brief. The full engagement report will follow shortly.

System pressures – what we are doing A priority area identified as part of the Winter Plan is Aberdeen City Health & Social Care Partnership's Hospital@Home service.

What is Hospital @Home?

Hospital@Home is a short-term, targeted intervention providing a level of acute hospital care in an individual's own home, equivalent to that provided within a hospital. Patients can be referred to Hospital@Home as an alternative to hospital admission or supported as an earlier than anticipated discharge from hospital when a patient is still requiring ongoing medical support. Both pathways help to relieve the pressure on acute in-patient hospital settings, as well as delivering improved outcomes for the patient.

Within Aberdeen City, our Hospital@Home service has been in development since 2018. There are currently 35 beds, 25 of which are frailty, 5 Outpatient Parenteral Antibiotic Therapy (OPAT), and 5 end of life care within Rubislaw Park Nursing Home. We have a multi-disciplinary team consisting of medical staff (Consultants and GPs), Advanced Nurse Practitioners, Nurse Practitioners, Registered Nurses, Senior HealthCare Support Workers, Occupational Therapists, Physiotherapists, Pharmacy and Admin as well as trainees in various disciplines. We currently have Advanced Practitioners from the Scottish Ambulance Service working as part of the team too.

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What's next?

We will develop new pathways, and new bed capacity, by focusing on acute and respiratory medicine. We have funding for 15 beds to support this identified through pre-existing MDT monies, which is well on the way to being fully recruited to. We also have additional funding which has been secured through a business case to create a further 8-10 respiratory beds with dedicated, specialist respiratory input.

An organisational change in relation to extending the service hours is under way.

We have a test of change underway consisting of H@H team members attending ARI (ward 102, AMIA and ED) to assist with patient flow from those areas into H@H.

We have started work with the Flow Navigation Centre with a view to establishing a pathway for referrals as well as from Care Homes

We also have a local aim of increasing our bed base to 100 beds by 2025. This is outlined in the Aberdeen health and social care partnership's strategic plan
