COVID update The latest ONS survey reported a second consecutive weekly drop in infection levels across Scotland, with 1 in 20 people estimated to have the virus in the 7 days to 26 July (1 in 19 the week before). The positive trend continues when we look at hospital care in Grampian, with a 22% reduction in COVID-19 admissions last week and hospital occupancy, which has been falling since mid-July, also seeing a drop last week of 21%. All in all, we can say with greater confidence we are over the peak of this current wave. Good news and some welcome respite. We continue to encourage everyone to show COVID sense, through regular LFD testing (still available to patient-facing staff), wearing masks wherever required, and practicing regular, thorough, hand hygiene.
