

# Annual Procurement Report 2022 – 2023

#### Introduction

This annual procurement report has been published by NHS Grampian in accordance with the Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act 2014. This report covers the reporting requirements for NHS Grampian for 1st April 2022 to 31st March 2023. The report includes the required summary in Annex A.

NHS Grampian provides health care services for the half-million people in the Grampian area and in financial year 22/23 had a trade spend with third party suppliers of around £299m, the table below shows a high level overview of the categories of spend. This data is taken from the Scottish Government Procurement Information Hub and uses the category allocated by the Hub for the main activity of the supplier.

These works, products and services are sourced through regional and national framework contracts where possible. Within NHS Grampian the Procurement Service and the following areas have designated procurement responsibility; Pharmacy, Laboratory Medicine, e-Health, Medical Equipment Management Services, Planning, Innovation and Programme and Estates and Estates Projects.

This annual report is an opportunity to review delivery against the commitments made in the NHS Grampian Procurement Plan 2018-2023. This report demonstrates NHS Grampian's commitment to ensure that the procurement spend is being used effectively to achieve best value and safe operation of services in conjunction with improving social, economic and environmental outcomes in our area.

The Procurement Service in NHS Grampian provides a comprehensive procurement and supply chain service. Undertaking contract development, implementation activities and ensuring supply chain resilience while providing leadership and support to all services within NHS Grampian.

#### **Summary of Regulated Procurements Completed**

The table in Appendix 1 summarises the regulated procurement activity completed by NHS Grampian (above £50,000) in 2022-2023:

#### **Review of Regulated Procurement Compliance**

Procurement activity supports NHS Grampian's Plan for the Future by ensuring that required works, products and services are delivered at best value and are fit for purpose. The detailed breakdown of the procurement activity for 22/23 is available in Annex A and all of the regulated procurement activity listed above has been carried out in accordance with the NHS Grampian Procurement Plan 2018-2023.

NHS Grampian continue to collaborate with National Procurement and other health boards and on a regional level NHS Grampian Procurement Service are working with colleagues in East and North regional health boards to scope a future operating model for procurement to create value and streamline processes across the participating health boards.

During 2022-23 NHS Grampian Procurement Service worked with partners across other health boards in the East and North region to develop the NHS Procurement Development Programme. The programme was delivered by Scotland Excel and covered two cohorts for procurement staff at operational and strategic level to ensure that there is continued development in our procurement skills and expertise.

NHS Grampian achieved Real Living Wage accreditation in August 2022. While pay in the NHS in Scotland is set nationally and was already above the living wage, NHS

Grampian made a commitment to work with contractors, many of whom were willing to achieve accreditation too.

### **Supported Businesses and Community Benefits Summary**

NHS Grampian are committed to facilitating the involvement of supported businesses through our procurement processes. In 2022-23, a small amount was spent with supported business, as recorded in Annex A. In addition, there is a subcontract clause in the National Procurement contract for NHS Staff uniform which requires the awarded supplier to sub-contract 15% of the activity to a supported business. The total in Annex A includes 15% of the Board's spend with the national uniform supplier to represent spend with Haven, the supported business subcontracted through the contract.

NHS Scotland National Procurement launched the Community Benefits Portal and the Procurement Service is working closely with local Public Health colleagues to increase the community benefits delivered through this portal. In addition to the portal, community benefits have been scored through procurement processes. An example is the Link Workers for Aberdeen City, where providers were asked to detail the community benefits which would be delivered as part of this project. The awarded provider has committed to delivering mental health training and workshops to partners, third sector organisations and SMEs and developing partnerships with local foodbanks and agencies that provide information and advice around food and fuel poverty.

During 22/23 community benefits continued to be delivered against The Baird Family Hospital and The ANCHOR Centre construction projects which amount to a £261 million building development on the Foresterhill Health Campus in Aberdeen. The new buildings will provide modern healthcare facilities to support and enhance the provision of clinical care delivered by NHS Grampian.

Community benefits have been a feature of delivering these new facilities from the outset and NHS Grampian has been involved with Graham Construction in ensuring there has been a particular focus on the creation of opportunities for Small to Medium sized Enterprises (SMEs) and Third Sector partners. In support of this, 'meet the buyer' events were held in Aberdeen and Inverness. The aim is to work with local companies located within 40 miles of the project, where possible and 52% of local companies have obtained work packages on the project.

In the period since the previous report, community benefits have been delivered resulting in 50 work placement days, 23 new jobs created, 7 graduates employed. A total of 10 work experience opportunities have been supported in this period, encouraging local young people in to the construction workforce. These figures,

alongside the provision of support to 37 apprentices, far exceed the social value target set by the project.

Graham Construction have achieved the silver award with the National Healthy Working Lives initiative, which aims to support a healthier and more motivated workforce, reducing work-related ill health and providing overall wellbeing support to employees. Employees are encouraged to train and develop further in their roles by obtaining accredited qualifications in relevant specialities. To date, 55 training events have been carried out for employees, including 4 for NHS Grampian staff.

The Baird & ANCHOR site is registered under the Considerate Constructors Scheme and Graham Construction have achieved a score of 15 out of 15 in all three categories - Care for the Environment, Respect the Community, Value their Workforce.

Local charities continue to benefit from the Baird and ANCHOR project, with the Archie Foundation receiving a £2,000 donation from Graham Construction to top up the Archie Toy Boxes used by play teams and ward staff across NHS Grampian, NHS Tayside and NHS Highland regions. As part of their commitment to delivering lasting impact, Graham Construction has partnered with Charlie's House, a charity dedicated to Improving the quality of life for children in the North-east of Scotland who have life-limiting or life-threatening conditions. Through this partnership they deliver quality food at a reasonable price to the workforce on the Baird & Anchor project through the Social Enterprise café "Re-charge" which was set up onsite in June 2022, and has been a great success to date, with all profits going back into the charity.

NHS Grampian adhere to the obligations outlined in the Sustainable Procurement Duty which require public bodies to consider what improvements can be made to social, environmental and economic wellbeing. Procurement staff have undertaken the Procurement Climate Literacy training and continue to promote the use of the Warp-it tool throughout Grampian. During 2022/23 NHS Grampian have been working on a new sustainability strategy and the Procurement Service and devolved procurement services have been involved in the implementation.

#### **Future Regulated Procurements Summary**

A summary of future regulated procurement planned during the next 24 months (April 2022-March 2024) can be found in Appendix 2. These may be subject to change.
